In its effort to fight poverty, Opportunities for Otsego is seeking community volunteers to serve as Navigators. Navigators agree to be trained in the Opportunity Community model and commit to using their networks to assist Neighbors living in poverty to access resources and supports for moving and staying out of poverty.

Once trained, Navigators will be paired with Neighbors that are struggling with poverty. Pairing will occur at the Opportunity Conference, scheduled for Saturday, May 12th in Oneonta. The conference will be led by Dr. Donna Beegle, a nationally renowned speaker who broke free from a life of generational migrant-labor poverty.

NAVIGATOR? Specialty
Navigators are community
members that work in
organizations that provide
resources or opportunities
like colleges, hospitals,
housing, courts, schools, and
other professions. Specialty
Navigators agree to take
and return calls from
Navigators and to assist
them in understanding how
to navigate their system.

WHAT IS A SUPER
NAVIGATOR? Super
Navigators are people that
have experienced poverty
but have made strides to
move out. The purpose of a
Super Navigator is to offer
support to Navigators that
struggle to connect with
their Neighbors in poverty.
