An Involved Father Means..

Direct interaction between a father and child (such as during play, caretaking)

Accessibility/availability to his child when needed

Responsibility of managing and providing resources for a child

Building a support network for children as they grow up

Father involvement changes with the age and developmental stage of a child. For example, fathers take on a nurturing role with infant children, and they act more as "teachers" in the toddler years.

Why Fatherhood Matters

according to Dr. Kyle Pruett, child psychiatrist and clinical professor

Kids who experience discipline from both Mom & and Dad learn a wide array of problem-solving skills.

Active and nurturing fathering enhances verbal skills and intellectual functioning.

The way a father plays with a child helps with emotional and social development.

Teenagers with supportive fathers have greater optimism and self-efficacy, leading to better school achievement.

A positive male role model helps adolescents develop positive gender-role characteristics.

Children who have an involved father are more likely to be emotionally secure, confident to explore their surroundings, and able to develop better social connections.

Research shows: when a child grows up with a father who is present, that child is:

- four times less likely to live in poverty
- less likely to suffer emotional and behavioral problems
- · less likely to face abuse and neglect
- less likely to abuse drugs and alcohol
- two times less likely to drop out of school
- seven times less likely to become pregnant as a teen
- less likely to commit a crime
- less likely to become involved in delinquency
- more likely to experience healthy overall psychological adjustment
